

Broad-leaved Helleborine

Flowers

Up to 60 but can have 100 flowers

Colour: Yellowish Green - Dusty Pink

Inner cup: Dark Brown to Purple
Epichile: Heart shaped dull Green to Purple in colour.

Overview

10-80cm tall

Pale Green stem turning

Purple towards base

Flowers are positioned one - sided on the stem

Leaves

4-10 leaves spiral the stem
Deep veins/lines going up the leaf.

Lower leaves are wide and rounded

Upper leaves become narrower towards the top.

Up to 25 flowers
Colour: White
Inner Cup: Chocolate Brown
Epichile: White broad heart shape

Overview

20 - 50 cm tall
Stem Green turning Purple at the base
Fine hairs near top of stem
Flowers are positioned one - sided on stem

Leaves

3-10 leaves
Leaves are Yellowish Green
Deep veins/lines going up leaf
Arranged in two opposite rows up stem

Marsh Helleborine

Flowers

Up to 25 flowers
Colour: Purple with White lip
Flowers are 'open' compared to other Helleborines
Inner cup: White with Purple veins
Epichile: White with ruffled edges



Overview

20 - 45 cm tall
Stem Green turning Brown to the top
Visible hairs on stem
Flowers are positioned one - sided on stem

Leaves

4-8 leaves
Leaves sometimes flushed Purple
Lower leaves are oval
Upper leaves are thin/'strap' like with pointed tips

Green - flowered Helleborine

Flowers

Up to 35 flowers
Colour: Green and White
Flowers are pendula/ hang down loosely
Inner Cup: Light - Bright Green
Epichile: Heart shaped with pointed tip folding backwards

Overview

7 - 50 cm tall
Stem Green turning Purple at base
Sometimes has scattered hairs on stem
Flowers are positioned one - sided on stem

Leaves

Up to 16 leaves
Leaves are well spaced along the stem
Leaves range in shape from rounded (typically near base) to thin/ 'strap' like (typically near top of stem)
